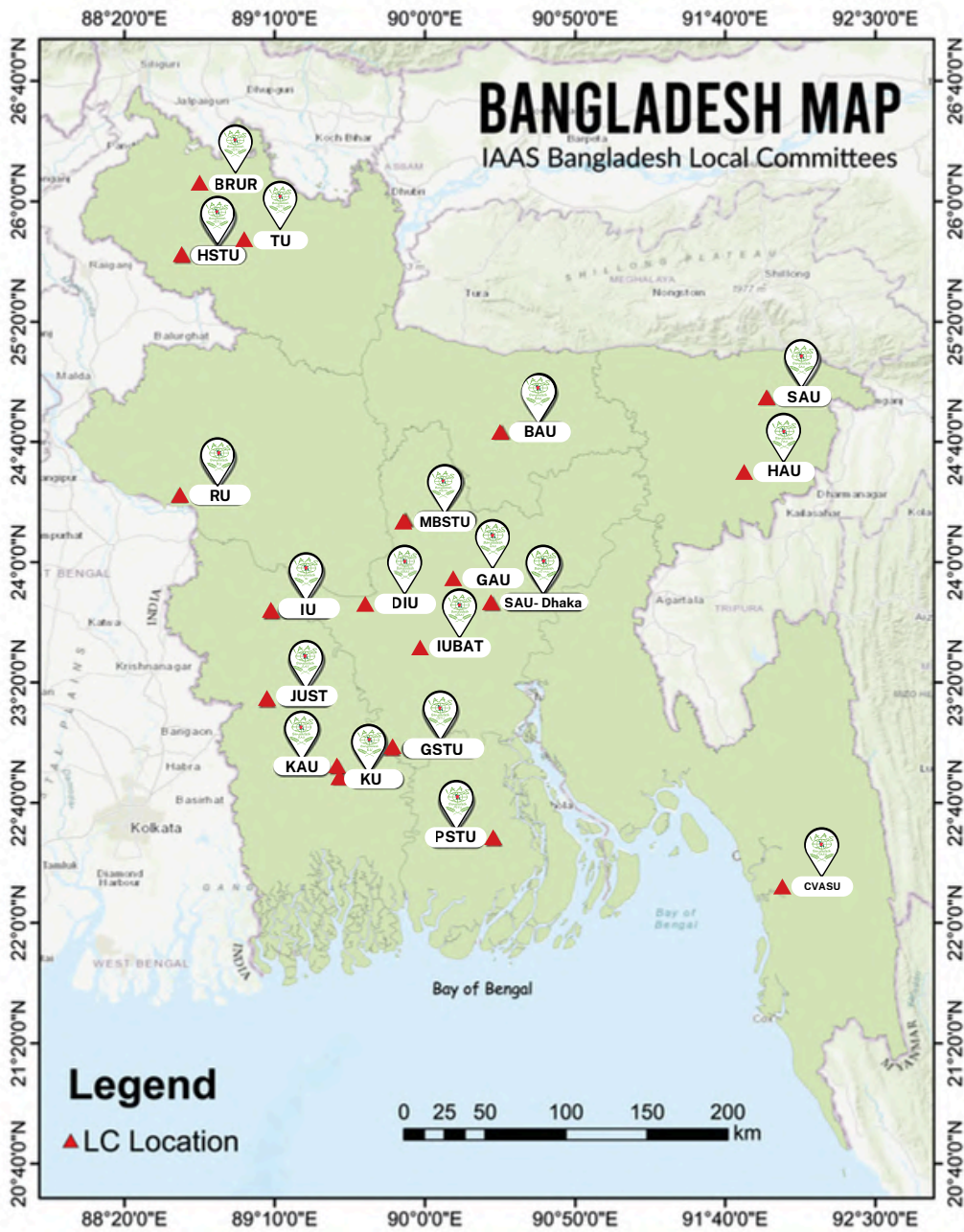

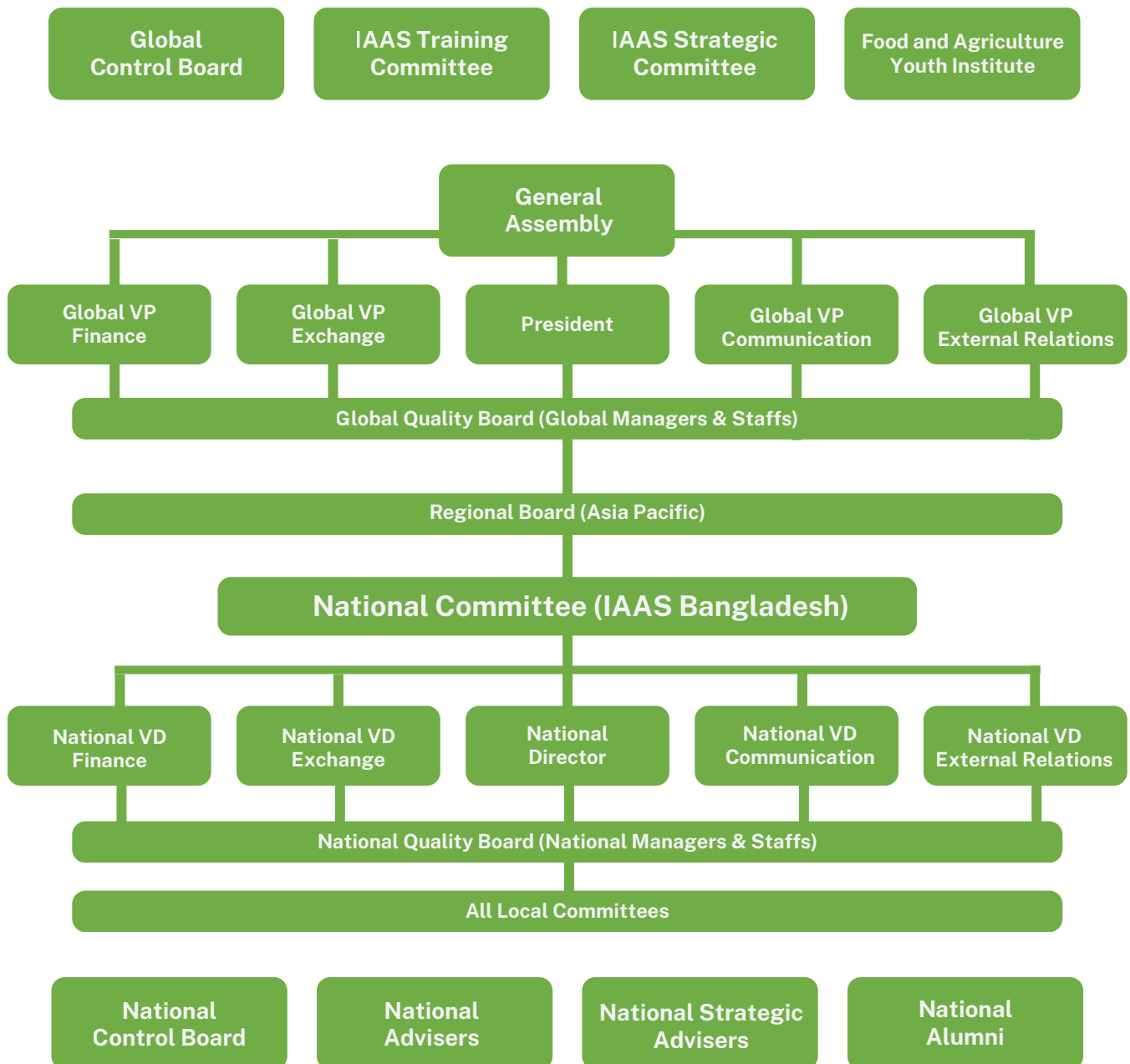

5th IAAS Bangladesh National Congress

19th December 2025, On the opening day the energy was electric from the very first moment. The 5th IAAS Bangladesh National Congress kicked off at Gazipur Agricultural University under the bold theme "Advancing Agrofrontiers: Youth-Led Innovation for Climate Resilient Agriculture and Technology Transfer." Day 2 took the congress to an entirely new dimension. Participants embarked on an immersive excursion to BRRRI and BARI; two of Bangladesh's most prestigious agricultural research institutions; where cutting-edge science met real-world application. The journey continued into the tranquil embrace of the Madhupur Bhawal Forest, offering a rare blend of nature and reflection. The day concluded with an insightful session that beautifully wove together technical knowledge and the explorer's spirit, leaving every participant inspired, grounded and ready to lead.



Asia Pacific Directors Meeting 2025

June 27 was the day when the curtains rose on one of the most anticipated regional gatherings of agricultural youth in the Asia Pacific. The Asia Pacific Directors' Meeting 2025, organized under the banner of IAAS, commenced at Hajee Mohammad Danesh Science and Technology University (HSTU) in Dinajpur, bringing together delegates from eight countries alongside students from 16 universities across Bangladesh. The atmosphere was electric from the very first moment warm welcomes, a hearty breakfast and an energy that only passionate young minds can create.

The grand inaugural session set a powerful tone with distinguished guests delivering addresses that resonated deeply with the spirit of the event. 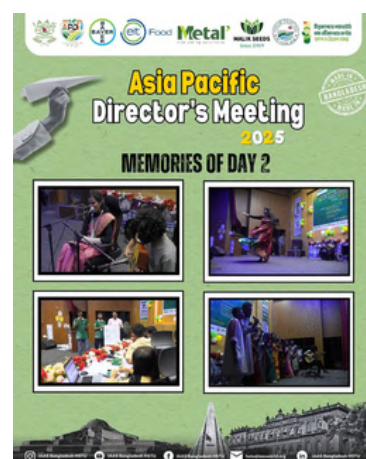

Dressed proudly in their APDM t-shirts, delegates embarked on an exciting Heritage Site Tour across some of Dinajpur's most culturally and agriculturally significant destinations Ramsagar, BWMRI and the historic Kantajew Temple. Each stop offered a window into Bangladesh's rich heritage and agricultural identity, turning the tour into far more than a sightseeing excursion.

After a warm communal lunch, the energy shifted to intellectual competition. Teams from across the region came together for the Case Solving Competition, tackling real-world agricultural challenges with sharp thinking and creative teamwork a true showcase of what youth-driven innovation looks like in practice.

As the sun set over Dinajpur, the day concluded with a vibrant Cultural Night that became the heartbeat of the entire event. Music, dance and performances from diverse national traditions filled the room, reminding every delegate that while borders may divide countries, the mission to bridge academic communities and empower young agricultural professionals is a shared one.

IAAS continues to connect and empower students of agriculture and related sciences through education, leadership development, and international collaboration and APDM 2025 was a living, breathing proof of exactly that.



67th IAAS World Congress 2024 (WoCo 2024)

History was made in the summer of 2024. For the very first time in the 67-year legacy of the IAAS World Congress, Asia became the host continent and Bangladesh rose to that momentous occasion with pride and purpose. The 67th IAAS World Congress spanned multiple iconic venues across Dhaka, Mymensingh, Patuakhali and Khulna a multi-city journey that gave international delegates a sweeping experience of Bangladesh's agricultural heartland. The congress was jointly organized by IAAS Bangladesh PSTU and IAAS Bangladesh BAU with the combined strength of local chapters turning an ambitious vision into a seamless, unforgettable reality.



The theme "Youth in Action: Challenges and Smart Solutions for Resilient Agro-food System" placed a spotlight on the vital role of youth in identifying and addressing challenges faced by farmers across sectors. In a world navigating climate change, food insecurity and rapid agricultural transformation, this theme resonated deeply with every delegate in the room.

The congress featured two major tracks. The Plenary Session covered constitutional matters including the General Assembly, membership reviews, country report presentations and the declaration of the new IAAS committee. The Working Session offered training sessions, scientific talks by leading experts, conferences, field visits, a Development Fund Night, a vibrant Cultural Night and a grand Gala Dinner. The field visits were a standout as delegates stepped into Bangladesh's farms and research stations, witnessing the country's agricultural resilience firsthand.

IAAS is spread across universities in over 55 countries worldwide and WoCo 2024 brought the best of that network to Bangladesh. Delegates arrived from across Europe, Asia, Africa, the Middle East and Latin America united by one shared mission.

Despite joining IAAS only in 2017, IAAS Bangladesh became one of its most successful and powerful members and WoCo 2024 was the ultimate proof of that. Hosting the world at home was not just an achievement. It was a statement.

- These plants will play a role in preserving environmental balance and controlling pollution.



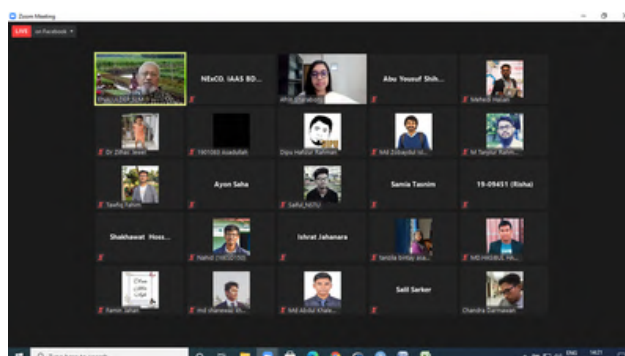
Post-Harvest Crop Preservation

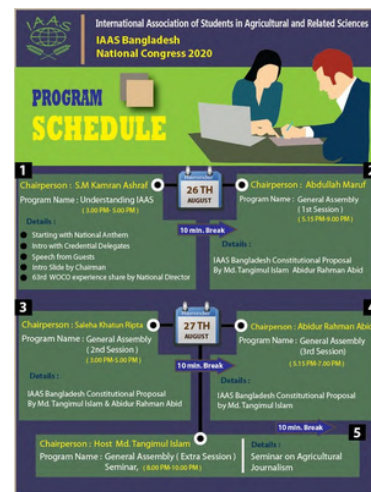
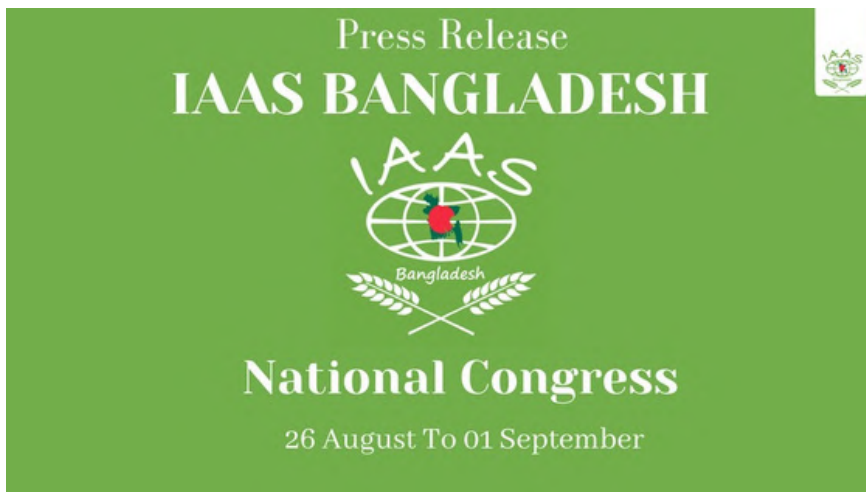
Workshop to Ameliorate Practice on Mushroom Cultivation

IAAS Bangladesh National Congress-2021

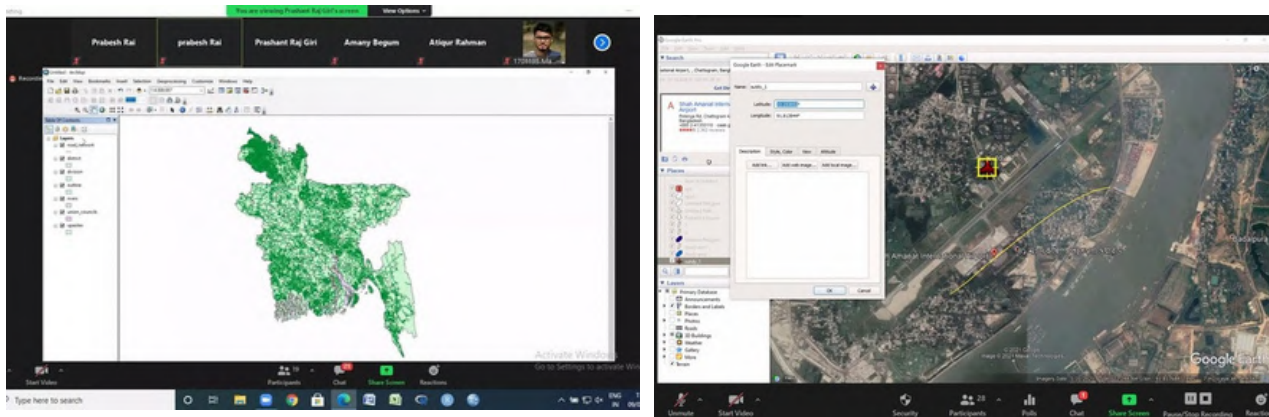
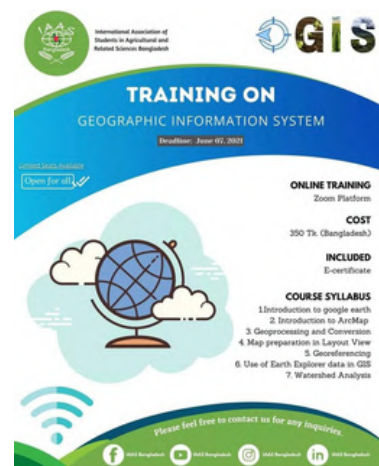

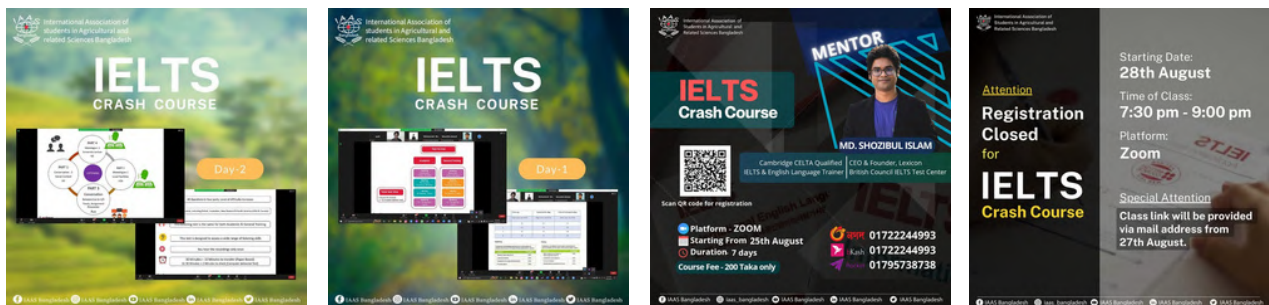
Exchange Opportunity

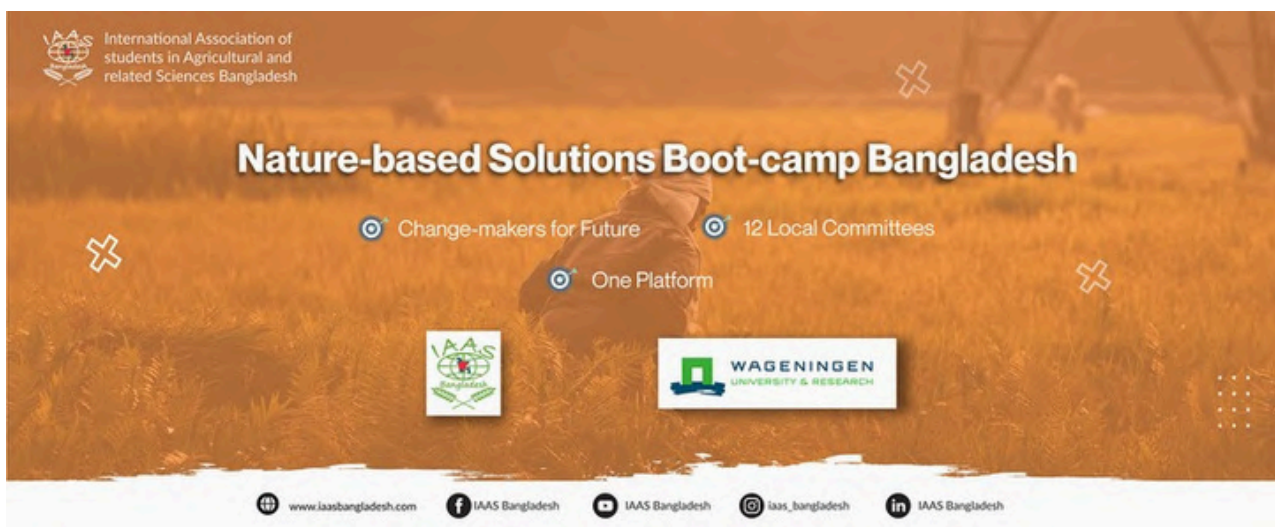
A Scientific Poster Presentation Competition on "Food Waste Management"

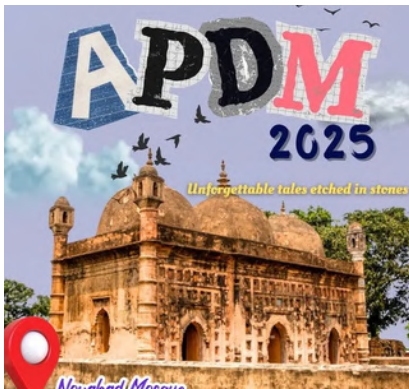

Asia Pacific Director's Meeting (APDM) 2025

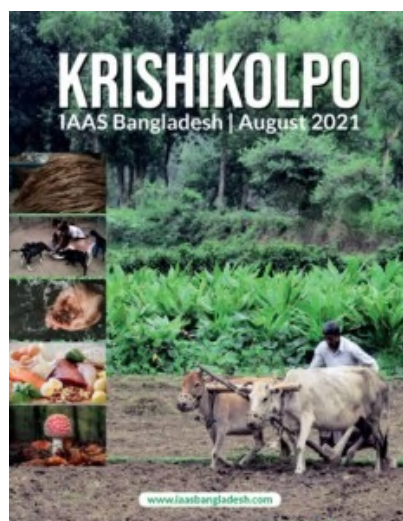
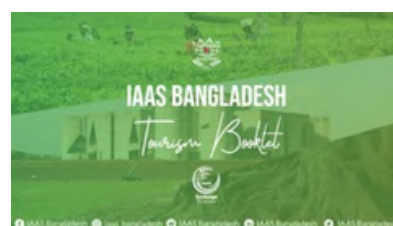
