


MESSAGE

History IAAS World



The International Association of Students in Agricultural and Related Sciences (IAAS) was established in 1957 in Tunis during a time of global recovery following World War II. Students in agriculture, inspired by the shared vision of peace and progress, united to create a platform for international collaboration and understanding. Initially called AIEA (Association Internationale des Etudiants en Agriculture), the organization used French as its working language.

The roots of IAAS can be traced to 1954 when agricultural students gathered for the first international meeting in Bucharest. This was followed by an international study week in Paris in 1956, which further strengthened the idea of global student cooperation in agriculture. These early efforts set the stage for the formal establishment of IAAS.



In 1957, Tunisia's UGET and the Netherlands' NSR played pivotal roles in overcoming a potential conflict as both planned agricultural seminars. Through diplomatic dialogue and collaboration, they merged efforts to organize the founding World Congress in Tunis. Delegates from eight countries, including Tunisia, Germany, Finland, and Switzerland, participated, with Mr. Tahar Belkhodja elected as President and Mr. Fehr as Secretary General. The second World Congress in the Netherlands in 1958 reinforced IAAS's mission of promoting diversity and cooperation. Today, IAAS unites students globally, addressing agricultural challenges through innovation and shared values.

Regional Board Asia Pacific



IAAS has five Regional Boards: the African Region, Asia-Pacific Region, Americas Region, European Region, and the Middle East and North Africa Region. IAAS Bangladesh falls under the Asia-Pacific Regional Board. IAAS Asia Pacific, as the regional branch of the International Association of Students in Agricultural and Related Sciences (IAAS), empowers youth by enhancing leadership, technical skills, and global connections. With a strong focus on sustainability, it aligns projects with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), promotes innovation, and fosters collaboration through regional events, exchange programs, and workshops. By connecting members with industry professionals and peers, it nurtures future agricultural leaders and advocates for youth-driven solutions to agricultural challenges, thereby contributing to food security and sustainable development. At present, this board coordinates IAAS activities across 10 countries.



Activities and Opportunities Exchange Programs: Students from member countries participate in cultural and academic exchanges to broaden their global perspective.

Regional Summits: Annual events where members discuss pressing issues in agriculture, share ideas, and develop strategies for collective action.

Workshops and Training: Sessions designed to build skills in sustainable farming practices, agribusiness, and modern technologies.

Networking: Opportunities to connect with industry professionals, researchers, and peers.

History IAAS Bangladesh



The Inception of IAAS Bangladesh

IAAS Bangladesh was established on October 10, 2017, through the visionary efforts of Md. Jahidul Islam Sajal and his peers. Initially founded as KUAAS, the organization joined IAAS World the same year, evolving into IAAS Bangladesh. In 2018, IAAS Bangladesh PSTU became the second local committee, marking a significant milestone. That year, the first National Board was formed, with Md. Jahidul Islam serving as the inaugural National Director, laying the foundation for transformative leadership.

Growth and Milestones

IAAS Bangladesh experienced remarkable growth in the ensuing years. By 2020, eight new local committees had joined, and the first-ever National Congress was successfully conducted online by NB 2019-20. Under Saleha Khatun Ripta's leadership, the third National Board introduced Krishikolpo, sparking agricultural dialogue. In 2021, IAAS Bangladesh expanded digitally by launching its official website and welcomed IAAS BAU as the 11th local committee. The first offline National Congress in 2022, hosted at Sher-E-Bangla Agricultural University, became a pivotal event, culminating in the election of the fifth National Board.



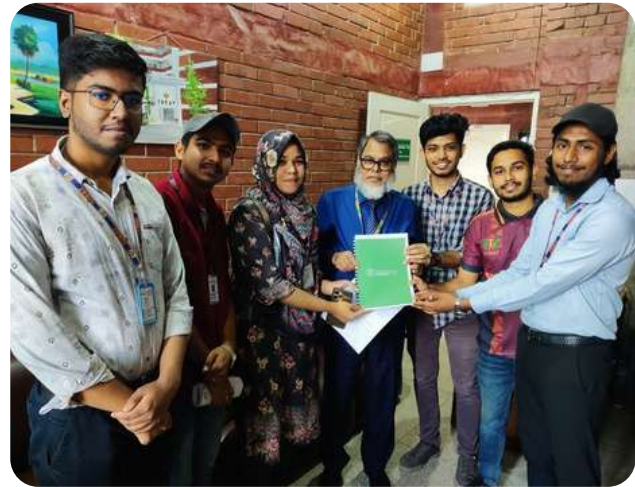
Establishing a Legacy

By 2023, IAAS Bangladesh had solidified its global presence, successfully hosting ICYA 2023 Asia Pacific at Bangladesh HSTU. Continuing this momentum, IAAS World Congress 2024 was triumphantly held in Bangladesh, underscoring its dedication to fostering global agricultural innovation and leadership.

Foundation IAAS Bangladesh IUBAT



The historical foundation of IAAS Bangladesh IUBAT represents a milestone in the evolution of agricultural student organizations in Bangladesh. While IAAS Bangladesh had long been a consortium of public agricultural universities, the integration of the International University of Business Agriculture and Technology (IUBAT) in November 2024 marked a paradigm shift by introducing the first private university into this national alliance.



The initiative was spearheaded on 14 November 2024 by eight visionary students from the BSc in Agriculture program, who recognized the urgent need to bridge academic theory with practical, youth-led solutions to the country's agrarian challenges.

These founding members—Rezwana Jahan Oyshe (LD), Roksana Alal Maria (VDF), Shahriar Mannan Imon Talukder (VDER), Md Atikuzzaman Shuvo (VDEx), Kamrul Hassan Rabbi (VDC), Shahoriar Sabbir Tulon (HCB), Sourav Kanti Bala (RPDO), and Md Ahnaf Tahmid (MO)—established the Local Committee under the guiding principles of the IAAS Bangladesh Constitution. Their endeavor was formally recognized through an inaugural ceremony on 24 December 2024, solidifying IUBAT's place as the 16th national member of IAAS Bangladesh.

Recognized by the IUBAT Registrar's Office, the Local Committee is guided by a 10-member Advisory Board led by the Dean of College of Agricultural Sciences & nine distinguished professors, and supported by a structured student governance model, IAAS Bangladesh IUBAT continues to stand as a pioneering platform where innovation, collaboration, and sustainability converge to shape future agricultural leadership.

Our University IUBAT



The IUBAT-International University of Business Agriculture and Technology, established in 1991, is the first non-government university in Bangladesh and a pioneering institution in higher education with a strong focus on agriculture. The idea of IUBAT was initiated by visionary leadership of its founder Professor Dr. M. Alimullah Miyan in 1989 during his academic collaboration with Kansas State University, USA. His vision was to establish a non-government university that could address the nation's pressing need for skilled human resources, particularly in the fields of agriculture, food security, and rural development.

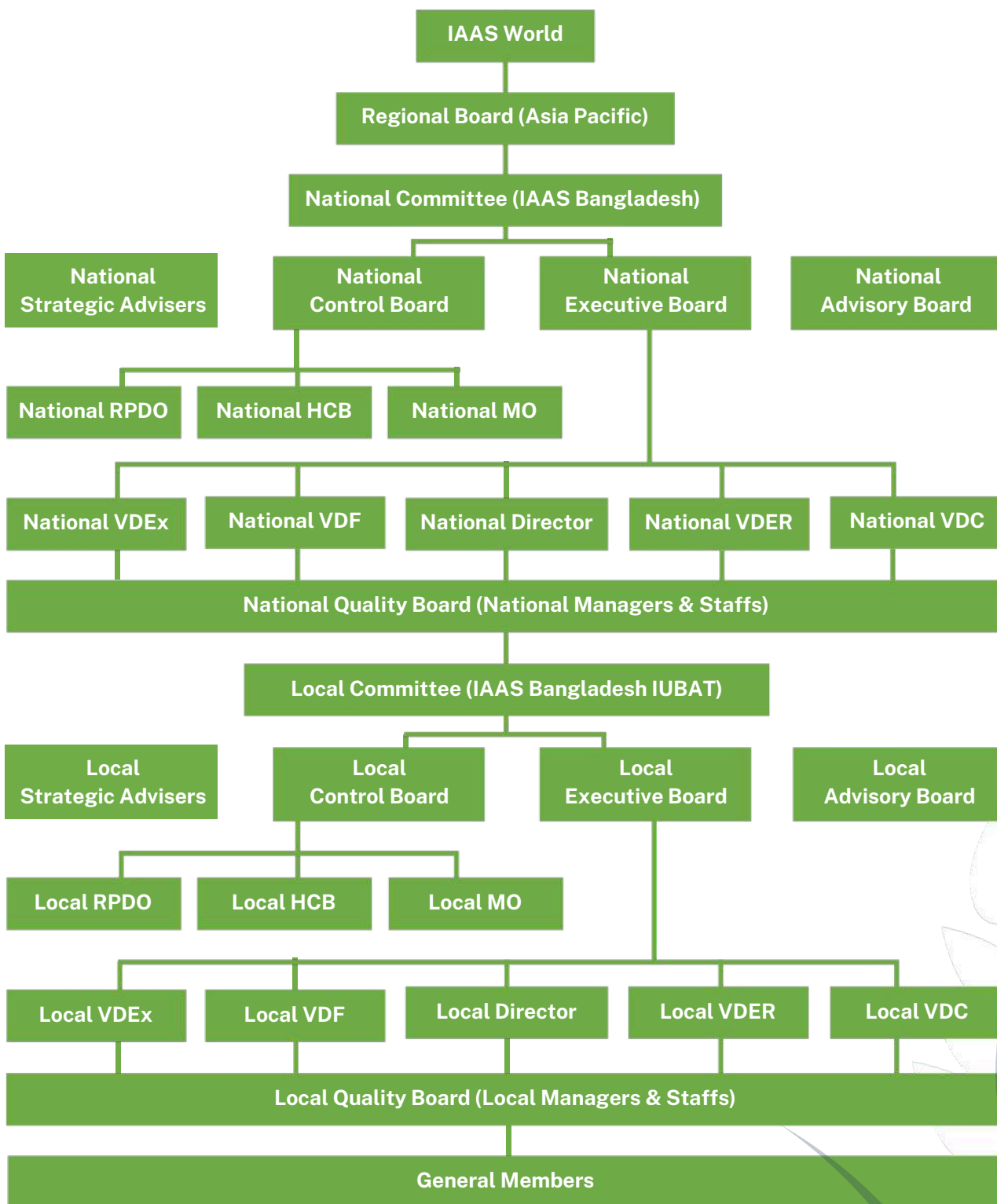


Since its inception, IUBAT has been committed to agro-economic development and sustainable resource management. Recognizing that agriculture forms the backbone of Bangladesh's economy, the university designed its academic structure to blend modern agricultural science with practical training. Importantly, IUBAT became the first private university in Bangladesh to introduce a Bachelor's degree in Agriculture (BSAg), opening new opportunities for students to pursue higher education in this vital sector. This program equips students with hands-on experience in crop production, soil management, biotechnology, agribusiness, and climate-resilient farming practices.

As a government-approved institution under the 1992 Non-Government University Act, IUBAT has continuously expanded its agricultural programs. Its BSAg graduates emerge not only as competent agricultural professionals but also as innovators and leaders capable of driving rural transformation.

Through education, research, and community engagement, IUBAT fosters self-reliance, sustainable farming systems, and food security—embodying Dr. Miyan's vision of transforming Bangladesh's agro-economy into a driver of national development.

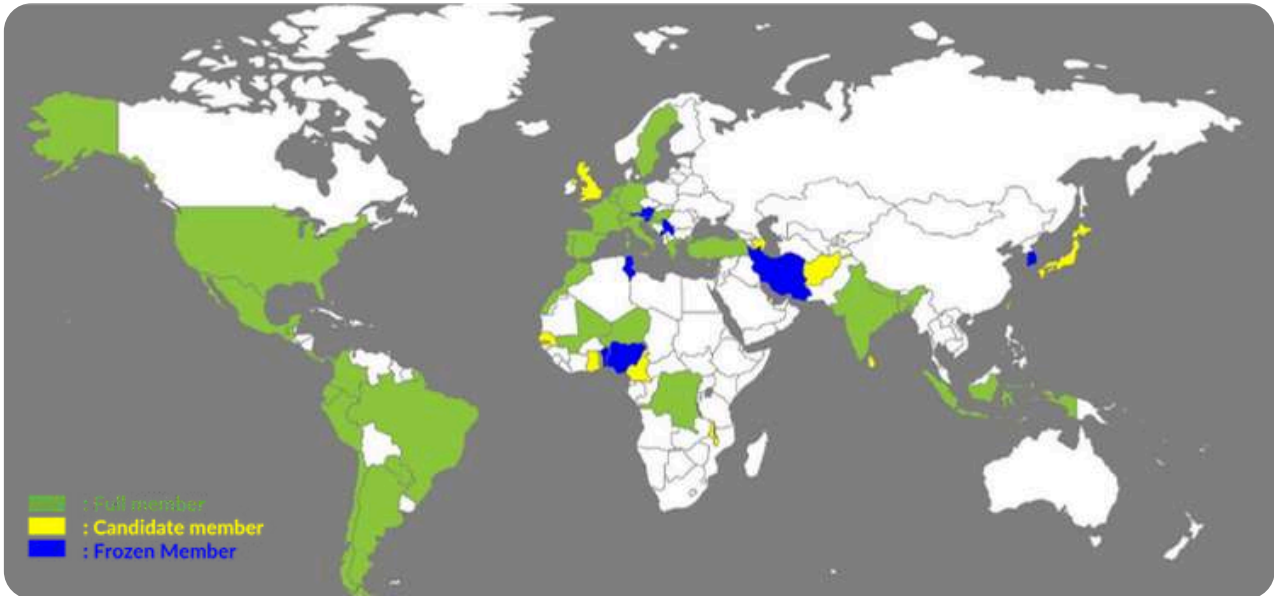

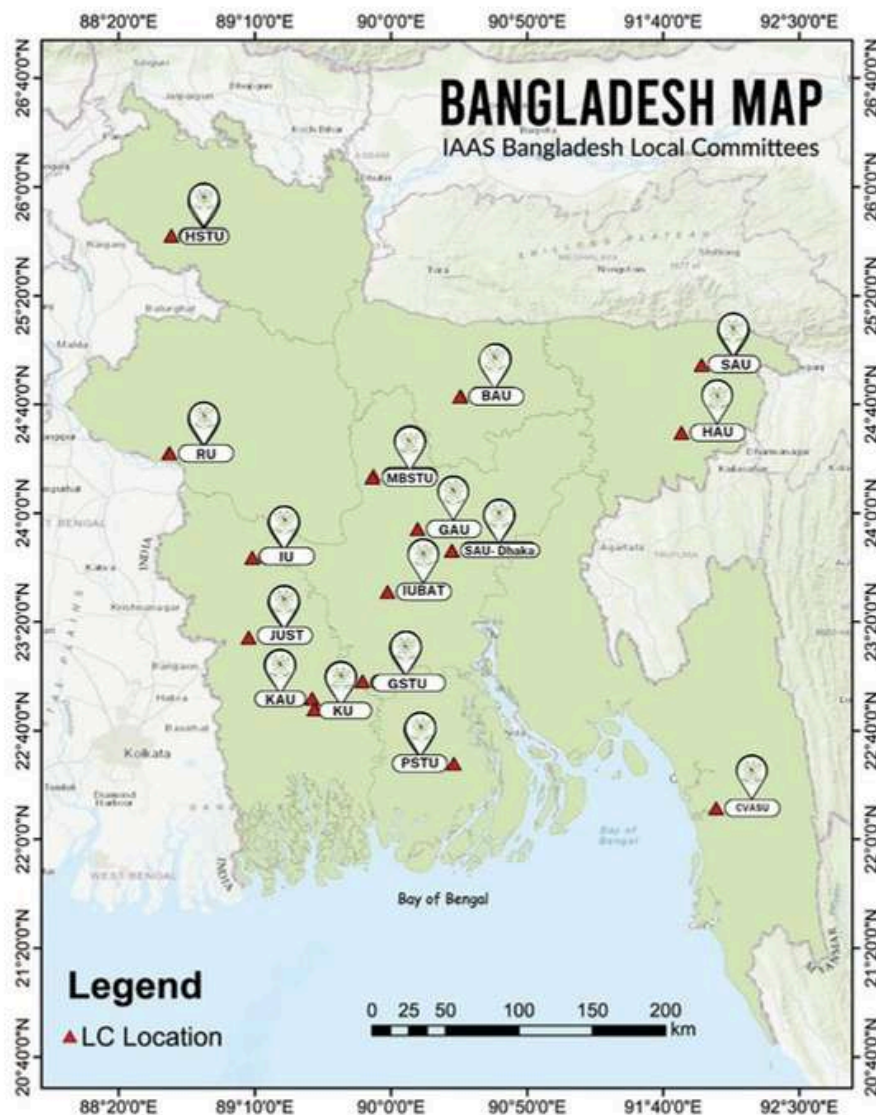

Ratnavandar is not just preservation – it’s a movement to cultivate resilience, innovation, and pride in Bangladesh’s agricultural legacy.

Project : Jagoroni

Empowering Women of Rural Communities through Value-Added Mango Products and Eco-Friendly Farming Practices.

Project Implementation Site: Bashkopa Village, Gazipur, Bangladesh Bashkopa, a lush agricultural village along the Chilai River in Sreepur, Gazipur, is the selected site for the WIA × VCP World Project Competition. On April 10, 2025, the Jagoroni Project Team conducted a field survey identifying key



issues: aging mango trees, high jackfruit wastage (~45%), pest damage, poor post-harvest management, river pollution from water hyacinth, and lack of modern farming knowledge. Project Goals: Empower local women through training and value-added processing of mango and jackfruit into products like mango bars, pickles, jackfruit chips, and traditional foods. Promote sustainable farming via training on modern techniques and reduced chemical use. Restore the Chilai River and introduce eco-friendly composting with water hyacinth and vermicompost.

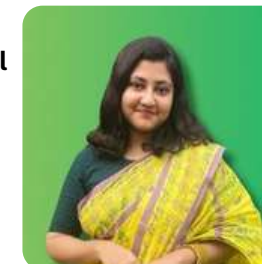

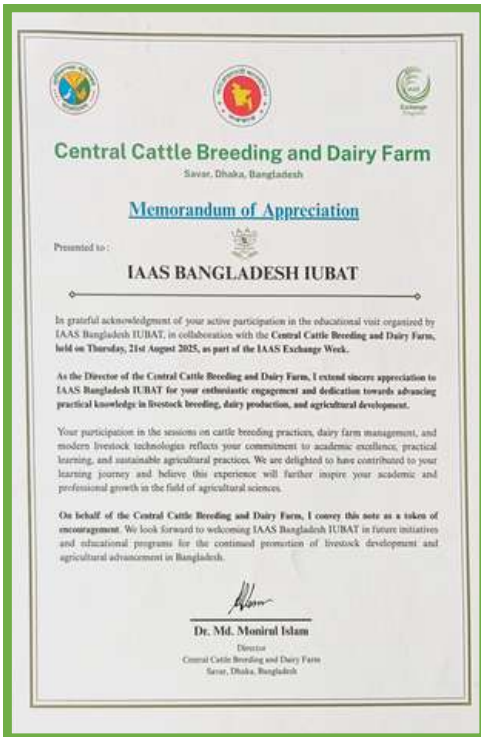

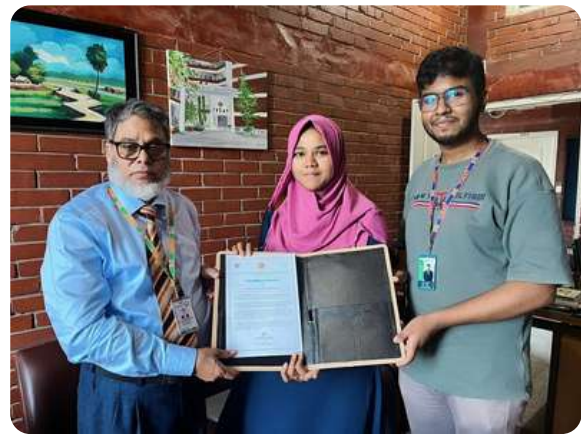
